NOTES

Operating Income: Liturgy and Worship are monies received from Weddings, Quinceañeras, Christmas and Easter flowers and Mass Intentions. Parish Ministries are monies received from donations to Outreach ministries. In the fiscal year ended June 30, 2023, Parish Ministries includes a special one-time gift.

Operating Expenses: Salaries and benefits for staff are allocated to each of the various cost centers. Archdiocesan Assessments are levied by the Archdiocese to support its projects and costs.

Non-Operating Income: PPP Loan Forgiveness represents the proceeds from a Paycheck Protection Plan (PPP) loan in FY 2022, (part of the C.A.R.E.S. Act) the parish applied for and received. The Basilica has complied with the technical terms and conditions for the PPP, and accordingly, the loan has been forgiven.


Non-Operating Expenses: Capital Campaign amounts represent expenditures that are part of the Save the Spires campaign. Certain expenses in the fiscal year ended June 30, 2022 Income Statement, have been reclassified to conform to the presentation in the fiscal year ended June 30, 2023, and in the fiscal year ending June 30, 2024, Comparative Income Statements.


As you can see in the Operating Income chart, our offertories continue to be steady, even though our Mass attendance, like in many other churches, has not yet returned to pre-pandemic levels. By viewing the chart of Operating Expenses you will notice our expenditures are closely managed. Our current fiscal year 2024 budget anticipates the same good stewardship will continue to enable us to fulfill our most fundamental call to be Missionary Disciples.



We have been addressing the various projects within Save the Spires one at a time over the last several years. The only project left is the painting of the Nave and Sanctuary. We have funds of about \$300,000 from the money we raised for that effort. About two years ago, we started to plan for the paint work. (You can read about how this process unfolded and who was involved here. https://sacredheartatlanta.org/for-such-a-time-as-this-genesis-of-the-plan/) The result of that planning effort is an interior redecoration master plan draft. This vision is what is on display on the website and on the posters at the entrance to the church. To more deeply describe the components of the master plan draft we created a Design Studio in the Rectory. We have been conducting 45-minute meetings in the Design Studio over the last couple of months. These sessions gather specific suggestions and feedback from members of our community, and these sessions will continue through the next several months. Once we have sufficient feedback, we will have the master plan draft rendered with adopted suggestions. We expect this will be in the Fall/Winter. This is an exciting time for our parish. Thank you for your active participation. As we conclude the celebrations of our 125th Anniversary of the Dedication of the Church, we look toward the next 125 years and consider all who will in the future follow in our footsteps. And, I do humbly ask for your prayers, that the Holy Spirit continues to help me shepherd us into the parish's future.





MINISTRY SNAPSHOT

Knights of Columbus

200+ parishioners served at Breakfast with St. Nick and a Lenten Soup Supper.

1,000 pounds of onions sold to fund \$500 seminarian stipend.

Donated \$200 to Uvalde, TX Relief Fund.

Supported many functions in the liturgy and provided hands-on support to local pregnancy support centers and local safe

Supported the Midtown Assistance Center (MAC) by collecting several hundred pounds of food and several large drums filled with coats for adults and children.

Sandwich Ministry

2.080 sack lunches made and distributed with coffee to local homeless (40 per week).

Prayer Shawl Ministry

34 shawls created with love. 18 parishioners, family and friends have been recipients this year.

Night Shelter Ministry

56 Church cleanings. (Every Friday Helped feed and house the homeless at the Bashor Men's Homeless Shelter 6 times from November - March.

Flower Guild

Members in five rotating teams purchase, condition, arrange, and water flowers in the church on a weekly basis with additional work during Christmas, Holy Week, Easter, weddings, and special liturgical events (which included this year's 125th Anniversary Mass).

Prayer Groups

Intercessory Prayer Group met monthly throughout the year to pray for intentions submitted through our parish website, the Book of Prayer Requests, and Prayer Card Requests filled out in the vestibule. The Knights of Columbus and Daughters of Isabella sponsored monthly rosaries prayed after the 10am Mass.

Children's Choir

12 children participated, singing at 5 masses and at Our Lady of Perpetual Help spreading the Good News!

Daughters of Isabella

Along with recruiting 5 new ladies, DOI sold 12 cases of pecans in their annual fundraiser and donated \$700 to: Ignatius House, Knights of Peter Claver, Queen Isabella Day (toiletries for homeless), Cristo Rey Scholarship, AACCW and Sacred Heart, and hosted their Annual Women's Retreat in Lent.

Young Adults (Cor Unum)

101 GroupMe members, 10 monthly Happy Hours, 4 monthly post-Mass Brunches, 2 Group Dinners, 1 swing-dancing event, and 9 summer Faith Circle Bible Studies.

Gift of Grace House

12 monthly themed Fish Fry dinners for the Gift of Grace House residents, 22 Fishing trips (1 that included residents), and 276 fresh fish served (Crappie, Catfish, Bream, and Bass)!

Hospital and Prison Ministry

These vital ministries (like so many others) have been on hiatus due to Covid-19. Earlier this summer, both resumed and we now have five Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist serving Emory Midtown Hospital every week and three volunteers working to restart regular visits to the Fulton County Jail.

St. Vincent de Paul


\$61,709 spent in charitable giving. 145 personalized individual assistance cases which covered rent and mortgage payments, stays in extended stay hotels, utilities, transportation, food cards, insurance payments. 2 night shelter meals catered, totaling \$1134. All of this was accomplished with 7 caseworkers, 2 officers, and 1 associate!

ONLINE GIVING

Since last year, we have increased from 200 to 256 active donors on our Online-Giving Platform. This safe and accessible system through Our Sunday Visitor does not require you to contact your bank to sign up or to make changes. You can use any of your checking or savings accounts and the funds will be automatically transferred to our parish bank account and

you can make changes at any time. You can see reports on your contribution history and generate tax statements at year end, and online-giving is more convenient for the parish than electronic checks from your bank.


